- President Biden has issued a [Major Disaster Declaration](#) for the LA Fires. Residents and businesses in wildfire evacuation zones can apply NOW for immediate and long-term federal relief.

 - The relief includes
 - Temporary displacement assistance (e.g., hotel costs for up to two weeks)
 - \$770 for essential personal items
